RESOLUTION NO. 15-07 AND RESOLUTION 14-12 AND THE RESTRICTIONS ON WATER USE CONTAINED THEREIN

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

On January 17, 2014, Governor Jerry Brown issued a proclamation declaring a drought State of Emergency in California after many years of low rainfall amounts throughout the State of California. On April 25, 2014 the Governor issued an Executive Order directing the State Water Resources Control Board (Water Board) to develop and adopt emergency regulations related to water conservation for all urban water suppliers.

In response to the Emergency Regulations adopted by the Water Board in July of 2014 the Twentynine Palms Water District (District) adopted Resolution 14-12 on August 27, 2014 implementing Stage 1 of the District's Water Shortage Contingency Plan putting in place certain water use restrictions.

Due to continued drought conditions in California the Governor on April 1, 2015 issued Executive Order B-29-15 requiring the Water Board to establish new regulations to achieve a 25 percent reduction in statewide potable urban water use. These regulations placed urban water suppliers into potable water reduction tiers with mandatory conservation requirements.

On May 27, 2015 the District adopted Resolution No. 15-07 which moved the District to Stage 2 of the Water Shortage Contingency Plan and superseded the prior Resolution No. 14-12 mandating stricter water use restrictions.

Following record precipitation amounts throughout most of California the Governor issued Executive Order B-40-17 on April 7, 2017, which terminated the drought state of emergency for most parts of the state and ordered Water Board to rescind portions of the Emergency Regulations.

In response to Executive Order B-40-17 it is in the best interest of the District to lift mandatory water use regulations contained in Resolutions No. 14-12 and 15-07.

RECOMMENDATION

Consideration to approve and adopt Resolution No.17-06 Rescinding Resolution No. 15-07 and Resolution No. 14-12 and the Restrictions on Water Use Contained Therein.

RESOLUTION NO. 17-06

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE TWENTYNINE PALMS WATER DISTRICT RESCINDING RESOLUTION NO. 15-07 AND RESOLUTION NO. 14-12 AND THE RESTRICTIONS ON WATER USE CONTAINED THEREIN

WHEREAS, on January 17, 2014, Governor Jerry Brown issued a proclamation declaring a drought State of Emergency in California, and on April 25, 2014, the Governor issued an Executive Order calling on Californians to conserve water and directing the State Water Resources Control Board ("Water Board") to adopt emergency regulations related to water conservation; and

WHEREAS, on July 15, 2014, the Water Board adopted an Emergency Regulation For Statewide Urban Water Conservation, and on March 17, 2015, the Water Board expanded the Emergency Regulation; and

WHEREAS, on August 27, 2014, the District adopted Resolution No. 14-12, which implemented Stage 1 of the District's Water Shortage Contingency Plan incorporated in the District's 2010 Urban Water Management Plan; and

WHEREAS, on April 1, 2015, the Governor issued Executive Order B-29-15 requiring the Water Board to take regulatory action to achieve a 25 percent reduction in statewide potable urban water use, and on May 5, 2015, the Water Board adopted a new Emergency Regulation to achieve the mandate in the Executive Order by placing urban water suppliers into tiers with mandatory conservation requirements; and

WHEREAS, under the May 5, 2015, Emergency Regulation, the District was required to reduce its total potable water production by 28 percent on a monthly basis compared to the same month's usage in 2013; and

WHEREAS, the District's amended final 2015 Urban Water Management Plan includes a Water Shortage Contingency Plan with prohibitions and actions required under stages of water shortages; and

WHEREAS, in response to the Water Board's May 5, 2015, Emergency Regulation, the District adopted Resolution 15-07, effective May 27, 2015, which moved the District to Stage 2 of the Water Shortage Contingency Plan and superseded the prior Resolution No. 14-12; and

WHEREAS, on February 2, 2016, the Water Board adopted an extended and revised Emergency Regulation extending water use restrictions on urban water use through October 2016; and

WHEREAS, on May 9, 2016, the Governor issued Executive Order B-37-16, which directed the Water Board to adjust and extend the Emergency Regulation through the end of January 2017 in recognition of the differing water supply conditions for many communities in the state; and

WHEREAS, on May 18, 2016, the Water Board adopted a new Emergency Regulation that replaced the February 2, 2016, Emergency Regulation and included a localized approach mandating that urban water suppliers, such as the District, adopt a locally developed conservation standard based upon each supplier's specific circumstances, and

WHEREAS, the Water Board extended the new Emergency Regulation on February 8, 2017; and

WHEREAS, following a winter season of plentiful precipitation throughout most of California, the Governor issued Executive Order B-40-17 on April 7, 2017, which terminated the drought

state of emergency for most parts of the state and ordered the Water Board to rescind those portions of its existing Emergency Regulation requiring a water supply stress test or mandatory conservation standard for urban water suppliers; and

WHEREAS, the Water Board is expected to take action pursuant to Executive Order B-40-17 in May; and

WHEREAS, in light of the Governor's Executive Order lifting the drought state of emergency for most areas in California, including the District's service area, it is in the best interest of the District to rescind Resolution No. 15-07 and Resolution No. 14-12; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Executive Orders B-37-16 and B-40-17 contain numerous provisions directed at "Making Water Conservation a California Way of Life," and

WHEREAS, the District's policy has been and will continue to be to encourage the wise use of water and to conserve water to the extent possible.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Twentynine Palms Water District as follows:

- 1. All of the foregoing Recitals are true and correct and the Board so finds and determines. The Recitals set forth above are incorporated herein and made an operative part of this Resolution.
- 2. The Board of Directors hereby rescinds Resolution No. 15-07 and Resolution No. 14-12 and declares that no stage of the Water Shortage Contingency Plan is in effect. As of the effective date of this Resolution, the provisions of Resolution No. 15-07 and Resolution No. 14-12 shall have no further force or effect.
- 3. The General Manager of the District is hereby authorized and directed to take any necessary steps to inform District customers of the action taken pursuant to this Resolution.
- 4. The Twentynine Palms Water District Board of Directors encourages the District's residential, business, and institutional customers to use water wisely and to conserve water to the greatest extent possible.

3. <u>Discussion of the Sustainable Management, Affordability, & Reliability for Twentynine Palms Water District (SMART) Plan and Possible Action to Implement</u>
Ed Vallerand, of Twentynine Palms, cautioned the District in moving forward with a joint agreement with the Marine base and City of Twentynine Palms for wastewater treatment and suggested the use of aerial surveys.

1. **ENGINEERING**

A. No items to report.

2. WATER QUALITY

- A. <u>Chlorine Levels</u>: Average levels maintained in the storage and distribution system ranged from a low of 0.10 mg/L to a high of 0.28 mg/L. Chlorination point (the point where chlorine is introduced into the distribution system) averages ranged from 0.06 mg/L to 0.57 mg/L.
- B. <u>Bacteria Samples</u>: A total of 38 routine bacteria samples were collected at test points for the storage and distribution system during this past month. In addition 7 special bacteria samples were collected. All routine and special samples indicated ABSENT for Collect.
- C. <u>Fluoride Samples</u>: A total of 16 fluoride samples were collected at established test points for the storage and distribution system, and 6 fluoride samples were taken from potable water production wells. Fluoride levels in the distribution system ranged from a low of .96 mg/L to a high of 2.6 mg/L. Fluoride measurements collected at the wells ranged from a low of 0.31 to a high of 1.7 mg/L.
- D. <u>General Physical</u>: A total of 10 general physical samples were collected from established locations as a part of routine testing requirements. Levels reported for color are <3.0, 1 for threshold odor and <0.1 0.3 for turbidity.
